Minister's Meditation

Welcome home! Welcome home everyone who is a member or a friend of our church. Welcome home anyone who has ever attended a Sunday service or a Thursday evening community dinner or an ecumenical service, a fundraiser dinner, or a religious education event. Welcome home anyone who has wondered what Unitarian Universalism is all about and who might consider on September 11th or any other day, to venture into our doors, hoping that you might be fully welcomed. Yes, our church year is resuming and we enthusiastically welcome you and yours to come in and take a seat. We have been waiting for you.

Our ingathering "welcome home" Sunday is happening on an auspicious day; September 11, 2011, the 10th anniversary of the day that 2 planes crashed into the World Trade Center, another plane crashed into the Pentagon and a 4th jet crashed in Pennsylvania. When we gather on this day we will be doing so with memories of tragedy and of heroism, with grief for all that was lost on that day and for the ongoing violence of war. We will be gathering as a religious people whose hearts and souls continue to spill over with hope and commitment for a diverse and peaceful community at home and abroad. If there ever was a year for us to focus ourselves on the purposes of church, this year is the one. And so when we welcome everyone into our sanctuary on September 11th it will be with a renewed passion for peace, for social justice, for a love that defies hate and for a hand stretched out to take in the stranger. As Rev Max Coots, a life long Unitarian Universalist minister so eloquently said "When love is felt or fear is know, when holidays and holy days and such times come, when anniversaries arrive by calendar or consciousness...when lives

are born or people die, something sacred is sensed in soil or sky, mark the time."

And so let us come back home and mark the time of this anniversary. Let us mark also the time that has passed over the summer by sharing in our annual water communion. Everyone who comes to the service on September 11th is asked to bring a small amount of water that represents what has touched you, healed you, challenged you or refreshed you this summer. We will pour this water and these words into a common bowl and in blessing the waters we will be blessing the people and the life of this church. Welcome home. We have missed you and we are so happy to be coming back together. Bring a bit of water. Bring yourself and even better: bring a friend or an acquaintance to church on September 11th. Start the morning off by sharing in a community breakfast in our social room and then come upstairs to the sanctuary, the place of safety and healing. Help us fill the water bowl with life and love, memories, commitments and hopes for a better world. This is our faith. Welcome home.

We have had an interesting summer in New England with tornadoes, an earthquake, and Hurricane Irene! Now it is time to turn our attention to autumn and transitions that it brings – back to school, cooler weather, resuming church services...

OPEN HOUSE

OPEN HOUSE ... You are needed at the second annual Open House on Saturday, Sept. 10, 2–4pm. Please join us as we invite the community in to learn who we are and how we "do church". Whether you can be there for the whole time or only 20 minutes, we need

you there! We will give tours, have crafts for the kids to do, and offer refreshments as we open our doors and hearts to curios people.

Great news for us! Susan, Dana, and Wendy are all returning as volunteers in the Religious Education program. Susan is back in the nursery with our smallest friends. Dana will again be with our youngest students in the *Chalice Children* class. Wendy will lead the 1st and 2nd graders in the *Explorers* class. Yours truly will volunteer with the *Seekers* class of grades 3–5.

On most Sundays, children will begin upstairs worshipping with their families. After the story for all ages, the children will proceed downstairs with their teachers to their respective rooms. Classes are designed to end at about 11am so we ask that if service concludes early, adults remain upstairs until that time to allow classes to finish without interruption. Thank you for understanding that it is difficult to maintain focus when people enter the parish hall while classes are in session. Usually on the last Sunday of each month, all the children will meet in the pine room for a Children's Worship during RE time. The different ages mix as we listen to one another, share stone communion, sing, and do a craft or activity. There are also intergenerational services scheduled throughout the church year when classes will not be held (though the nursery is available for children ages 3 and under). These are times that allow for everyone to worship in the sanctuary together.

The RE Committee (REC) is busy planning fun multigenerational events in the coming months such as mini-golf, apple picking, game day, bowling, and movie nights. Anyone is welcome to attend an REC meeting (scheduled as needed) and/or offer comments and suggestions for such events ... or for ideas about Religious Education, in general
