#### AN EDITORIAL

In her message in their latest newsletter, the minister of our Fitchburg church, the Rev. Leaf Seligman, quotes Wendell Barry, "We live the given life, not the planned." What is meant is that we cannot always do what we planned to do; we have to respond to those conditions that exist.

This is true for our congregation as well as it is for us as individuals. Our plans (or maybe they are only dreams) would have our Church be a dynamic, growing organization that is serving both our congregation and the community well. We would have a professional leader who preaches strong sermons to a goodly congregation on Sundays and amply serves the congregation's needs for pastoral care. We would have an active program of religious education with several classes for children of various ages and also regular group meetings for adults who want to further explore spirituality, ethics, and the ways we cope with life's vicissitudes. We would have our beautiful building actively used not only by our congregation but also by various community groups. And we would work to promote our principles both locally and through the Unitarian Universalist Association to the world.

Such, however, is not the case. In our given "life", we are a very small congregation struggling to accomplish as many of those lofty aspirations as is possible with very limited resources of money and person power. Since we are few, the burden it imposes on each of us is great. A very few of us are doing most of the work though somehow we are managing. Let me start at the top of our organi-

zation chart: our governing board is supposed to consist of six members. We currently have only three. A few years back there was only one man (me) on a fully filled governing board; now it is all men. (Shades of 1873 and probably 1913!) We used to have several people who would lead our Sunday services. Most of that load has now fallen on one man, Dave. (Your editor regrets that health problems have kept him from doing nearly as much as he did. Hopefully, these are mostly solved and he will again be able to do much more.) We badly need more people to step up. Yet the essentials are getting done. And we are trying to work with the other area churches toward a long term solution for too many small congregations in our area.

Money has almost always been a problem and is now an acute problem. We have a few members who have pledged generously. Yet more have pledged only modestly or have pledged nothing at all. Yet we manage to maintain Sunday services and have an active RE program staffed by qualified people. Our calendar is active. Our building is in good condition and is used frequently. It may not be all we would hope, but to a substantial extent we are living the "life" we have planned. How long we can do these things on our present income level in uncertain.

If our congregation is to prosper, we must find a way to move from the difficult "life" we are now given to one much closer to the "life" we have planned. To do so, we need more commitment on the part of almost everyone connected with our congregation. This probably means YOU.
