Set in Stone Moves into Phase 1 Bidding Stage

On Wednesday, September 25, five different masonry firms, all specialists in historic stonework repair, gathered at the church to examine the daunting task of repairing the church stonework. Phase 1 of this extensive project, funded by the Robinson-Broadhurst Foundation, focuses on the front entrance and quelling the water seepage that has

accelerated plaster deterioration in the interior archway. The firms will be submitting their bids for work within the week, and UUCW will be awarding the contract to one of the masons this month. Ideally, you should be seeing scaffolding and work beginning in earnest later this month before the weather gets too cold.

In keeping with our new "Pathway to Healthier Eating" initiative, we served two new and different meals this month. On September 12, Chef Dave Faucher served up herbed baked chicken and two different types of fall squash: spaghetti and acorn. Our educational placemats featured the rarely seen nor eaten spaghetti squash and diners eagerly forked up the nutty, buttery strands. On September 26, newly ServSafe certified Chefs Jill & Joe Sackett loaded ten ham and cheese quiches into the new commercial capacity double oven. The health benefits of the humble egg, now exonerated from its undeserved reputation of containing "bad" cholesterol, were outlined on the educational placemats. The plates were scraped clean!

The Winchendon Community Action Committee and Sunset View Farm (below) continue to provide generous donations of fresh produce which we readily incorporate into our meals. Recent examples include acorn squash, yellow onions, and grape and cherry tomatoes. We are most grateful for their support.
