A native of Texas, Bozeman has had dual careers both playing and building organs. He has performed across the United States and in Mexico, Canada, the Caribbean, France and Germany. He is currently Organist and Director of Music at the First Congregational Church of Pembroke, New Hampshire. Mr. Bozeman will be featuring the Chorales of J.S. Bach in an hour-long program. National Women's History Month: UUCW Women

March is National Women's History Month and gives us pause to consider some of the considerable contributions of UUCW women. With our upcoming pipe organ concert, we will focus on the role UUCW women played in the birth of our 1868 E. & G.G. Hook pipe organ.

In short, we have the women of UUCW to thank for having an organ at all. The original plans for the church did not include an organ. Catching wind of this, the church women lobbied successfully for an organ, and accordingly, one was ordered. Delays at the Boston factory prevented the organ from being installed in time for the building's dedication in 1867, but it was installed in February 1868. The organ was purchased largely through funds raised from a three-day long yard sale (the first of continuous yard sales held by UUCW since 1867).

The first church organist was Sophia Murdock Whitney, an accomplished keyboardist, with numerous women organists interspersed throughout its playing history.
